

People Who Use Opioid (Narcotic) Pain Medications Invited for a Research Study

Researchers at the University of Kentucky Department of Psychology are inviting individuals to participate in an ongoing research study. This study is focused on understanding factors that affect the mental and physical health of adults who use opioid pain medication (*with or without a prescription from a doctor*) and have a history of highly stressful or traumatic events. This study involves 1 visit to the laboratory and 4 weeks of brief, daily assessments.

Participants will be compensated up to \$135.



You may be eligible to participate if you:

- Are over the age of 18
- Have a history of at least one highly stressful or traumatic event
- Currently use opioid pain medications like:
 - o Hydrocodone (e.g., Lortab®, Vicodin®, Lorcet®)
 - o Oxycodone (e.g., OxyContin®, Percocet®)
 - o Oxymorphone (e.g., Opana®)
 - o Hydromorphone (e.g., Dilaudid®)
 - o Fentanyl (e.g., Fentora®)
 - o Meperidine (e.g., Demerol)
 - o Morphine (e.g., MScontin®, Ora-Morph SR ®)
 - o Tramadol (e.g., Ultram®)
 - o Codeine (e.g., Tylenol 3®)
 - o Buprenorphine (e.g., Suboxone®, Cizdol®)
 - o Methadone (e.g., Dolophine®, Methadose®)
